PromTime and Relyens sign partnership to use real-life patient outcomes following upper limb orthopaedic surgery to drive improvements

For the first time in France and Europe, upper limb surgeons (specialising in shoulder, elbow and hand problems) will be able to compare patient outcomes to improve functional recovery and enhance the quality of patient-surgeon relationships. The *PromHand* initiative is the result of a partnership between data science pioneer PromTime – an architect and auditor of real-life patient health gains – and the Relyens group, a risk manager for health institutions across Europe.

Using benchmarking to drive improvement

Through a secure digital platform, *PromHand* enables participating surgeons to compare their patients' functional and relational scores. The functional score quantifies the patient's degree of independence in their daily activities, on the basis of a scientifically validated self-completed questionnaire calibrated for digital use (Patient-Reported Outcome Measures – PROMs). Through the relational score, the patient assesses the quality of their relationship with their surgeon, based on factors such as empathy, availability and communication (Patient-Reported Experience Measures – PREMs).

The *PromHand* programme leverages these two scores in the belief that **surgeons' outcomes improve when benchmarked**, which optimises the appropriateness of care provided and drives value for all stakeholders in the health system. Relyens (via its entity Sham) shares this belief and is providing surgeons who wish to participate with an annual subscription to the *PromHand* programme. The aim is to encourage practitioners who are committed to advancing as part of the *PromHand* community of practice. Statistical comparisons are adjusted to patient severity profiles. The relational and functional scores are not disclosed to the insurer. The *PromHand* scientific board, whose members include representatives of the French Society for Hand Surgery, promotes peer-to-peer dialogue and healthy competition to drive improvements.

Accelerating patients' return to work

Each year in France, 40,000 new patients with musculoskeletal disorders are treated by the national health system. In 91% of these cases, the upper limbs (shoulder, arm or hand) are affected. These cases account for 30% of work stoppages, with an annual cost of €3.5 billion for the French health insurance system. Carpal tunnel syndrome alone accounts for nearly 2 million days of paid temporary disability leave.

The *PromHand* programme should help to reduce the duration of work stoppages, as well as disputes between patients and surgeons, two factors that significantly affect all stakeholders in the health system.
